The Eighth Juried Show of Photographs About
Life in the Miami Valley
October 10 - November 28, 2010



Eligibility

Any person is eligible to submit photographs. All work must be original and current, having been photographed after March 1, 2008. Photographs previously exhibited at the Troy-Hayner Center should not be submitted. Subject matter is Miami Valley life: its people, its places, its activities, etc. Submitted work must have been photographed in the following counties: Miami, Shelby, Darke, Greene, Champaign, Clark, or Montgomery.

Exhibition and Opening Reception

Through Our Eyes will be open to the public from Oct. 10 through November 28, 2010. Only works selected by the juror will be exhibited. The opening reception for the exhibition and awards presentation will be held Sunday, Oct. 10, from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. All participants are encouraged to attend the opening.

Juror - Bill Woody

Bill Woody is a photographer from Beavercreek, Ohio, who has been pursuing his art since 1970. In the 1980s, Bill photographed the Dayton Ballet Company, and his photos are a part of their permanent collection. He has also worked with Appalachian Institute for the Arts, contributing programs and photographs for their productions. Bill co-produced "Past, Present, and Future: The Great Smoky Mountains National Park," a two-hour docudrama with photographs of the mountains. He has participated in international competitions and has many acceptances and awards of merit. He has had one-man shows in Beavercreek, New York City, and Scottsdale, Arizona, and had work accepted in shows throughout Ohio. His prints are in private collections across the country. Recent projects have included the American West: the sand dunes, ranches, cowboys and old mining towns; Downtown Dayton Arcade; and general photography, including the cover for the book, "Gems of the Greater Dayton Region." Bill serves as a judge for photographic competitions for local groups, including a recent show at the Town & Country Fine Art Center, and the Photographic Society of America member clubs across the country.

Awards, Divisions, and Categories

A minimum of \$1800 in prize monies will be awarded. There will be five divisions: Rural images, Urban images, Life in the Miami Valley, Abstract, and Youth (students grades K-12). In each division, there will be cash prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places. One Best of Show will be selected from all entries. Hayner does reserve the right to not award all prizes if there are not enough entries in a division. All winners will be notified prior to the opening.

Entry Information

All entries must be delivered to the Troy-Hayner Cultural Center, located at 301 W. Main St., Troy, Ohio, from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on September 30 and October 1, or 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on October 2, 2010. Entries will not be accepted after 11:00 a.m. on October 2, 2010. Entries must be mounted and framed with glass or plexiglass, ready to hang (please use wire - no sawtooth hangers). Matting is encouraged. Clip frames are acceptable. Final dimensions of framed work must be no smaller than 8"x10", and no larger than 20" x 26", or exceed 46 united inches. Submissions that do not fall within this range of sizes will not be accepted. Entrants are permitted to have 3-dimensional works, however, the pieces may not exceed a depth of six inches. All entrants must have photographs clearly labeled with name, address, email, phone number, title of work, and where the photograph was taken on the back upper left-hand corner of the work. Entry forms must be filled out correctly, completely, and must be submitted with work. There will be a \$20 non-refundable fee per entrant, with a maximum limit of three photographs per entrant. Youths (18 and under) may pay a reduced fee of \$5.00. Please make checks payable to Troy-Hayner Cultural Center.

Return of Work

Notification of acceptance or rejection will be mailed after October 4, 2010. Accepted entries may not be removed from the exhibit before November 29, 2010, but must be picked up by December 3, 2010, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Agreement

Because the Hayner Center is a family-oriented community center, the Board of Governors reserves the right to determine what items will be displayed at the Center. Submission of work to this exhibition shall be understood to indicate an agreement on the part of the artist with the conditions set forth. This includes the artist's permission to have photographs of his/her work used for publicity and for promotion without compensation. Model release must accompany entry where applicable (release forms available at Hayner Center, on Troy-Hayner's website, or use your own).

Liability

All artists submitting work agree to abide by the above conditions. All entries will be given the utmost care and consideration. During the time that photographs are displayed at the Center, they will be covered by fine arts policy, however, property owners shall continue to be responsible for maintaining their own insurance coverage as well.

Accepted entries may not be removed from the exhibit before November 29, 2010. Works not accepted must be picked up by 5:00 p.m. on October 8, 2010, during Hayner's normal operating hours.
